







The (P. O. Dept.) name of my Office is Barnesville  
 \* Its local name is Barnesville  
 It is situated in the E. 1/2 of 21 + 24 1/4 of 15<sup>th</sup> quarter of Section 10, in Township Eight north (north or south), Range Six West (east or west), County of Belmont, State of Ohio

The name of the most prominent river near it is Ohio  
 The name of the nearest creek is Captina  
 This Office is 27 miles from said river, on the West side of it, and is 0 miles from said nearest creek, on the north side of it.  
 The name of the nearest Office on route No. 21, 267 is Jornerton, and its distance is 8 miles, by the traveled road, in a southerly direction from this my Office.  
 The name of the nearest Office, on the same route, on the other side, is Hammonds bush and its distance is 8 1/2 miles in a northerly direction from this my Office.  
 The name of the nearest Office off the route is Dora, and its distance by the most direct road is 5 miles in a S. Eastly direction from this my Office.  
 This Office is at a distance of 100 Rods from the Barnesville Station of the C. O. Div of Balt & Ohio Railroad, on the north side of the railroad.
