

2 or Meade (north or south), Range 2 (east or west), County of Belmont, State of Ohio

This Office is on the West side of it, and is 1/4 miles from said nearest creek, on the side of it.

The name of the nearest Office on route No. 12098 is Bellaire, and its distance is 3 miles, by the traveled road, in a North direction from this my Office.

The name of the nearest Office, on the same route, on the other side, is Pillsbottom and its distance is 0 miles in a South direction from this my Office.

The name of the nearest Office off the route is Businessburgh, and its distance by the most direct road is 3 miles in a S.W. direction from this my Office.

This Office is at a distance of 3/4 miles from the Wegon Station of the Bellaire & S.W. Railroad, on the East side of the railroad.



LOCATION OF PROPOSED POST OFFICE



The post office would be situated in the SW quarter of section No. 32, in Township 2 N Range 2 W of the ? principal meridian, County of Belmont State of Ohio  
(E. or W.) (N. or S.)

The name of the nearest river is Ohio and the post-office building would be at a distance of 1 mi on the West side of it.  
(N., S., E., or W.)

The name of the nearest creek is Wegee and the post-office building would be at a distance of 100 ft on the North side of it.

The name of the nearest office on the same route as this proposed post office is Shadyside Ohio and its distance is 2 1/2 miles, by the traveled road, in a NE direction from the site of this proposed office.

The post office would be 1 mi, air-line distance, West from the nearest point of my county boundary.
